Friendship Center in Montecito working to recover

Since its patio, courtyard, and outdoor areas sustained ash damage during the Thomas Fire in December, the Friendship Adult Day Care Center has been working on its Garden Project, a spruce-up of the impacted spaces.

Friendship Center advancement and project manager Gabriella Forrester said the finished project will provide enrichment and enjoyment to the dependent adults who visit the center during the day to play games, eat lunch and relax in solitude.

Ms. Forrester told the News-Press that the center shut down during the Thomas Fire on Dec. 8 and stayed closed through the Jan. 9 debris flow.

The center reopened Feb. 2, but debris needed to be cleared from the center's patio and outdoor areas.

In addition to replacing chair cushions and refinishing tables and chairs that suffered ash damage, the Garden Project will construct new outdoor spaces for its visitors to converse with one another. The conversational areas will be separated with raised succulent planters, which will allow the guests to apply what they've learned in the center's weekly gardening classes without needing to lean over.

Ms. Forrester said gardening is helpful and therapeutic to the center's dementia-afflicted quests.

"Gardening is a sensory enrichment that is calming to folks with dementia and is entertaining for them," she said.

The project will include improved sectional seating arrangements and

added walkways that will allow the center's members to safely explore the grounds without risk of falling over something.

"Our members are mobility limited and diagnosed with some sort of dementia, so anything that is a fall hazard needs to be put out of the way," she said.

The Friendship Center does not yet have an end date for the Garden Project and has been raising funds since July 16, with a goal of \$40,000. Most of the money raised will go toward garden repairs and new furniture for both its Montecito and Goleta locations.

Ms. Forrester said she hopes the completed project will not only help the center's guests enjoy the remainder of their waning years, but feel appreciated as well.

"This is some of the last outside time our members will have. We want them to feel valued and to enjoy their lives," she said.
